Kōchiyama Sōshun (1936) Kaneko, a masterless samurai, favors a young stall owner Onami. Through her troublesome brother's visits to Kōchiyama Sōshun's tavern, Soshun gets to know her and he is attracted to Onami.

Anjōke no Butōkai (*A Ball at the Anjō House*) (1947) The Anjo family, who used to be noble and wealthy, are in decline and have to give up their house. They hold one last ball at the house before they move out, and try to cancel all the debt they owe.

Aoi Sanmyaku (Blue Mountain Range) (1949) A student in an all-girls school, Shinko Terasawa, meets Rokusuke Kanatani at a general store. She later receives a mysterious love letter, about

which she discusses with her school teacher Ms. Shimazaki and other students in her class. However it gets the entire school in an uproar.

Banshun (Late Spring) (1949) A university professor has a daughter who won't marry because she will have to leave her father who must then live alone. Worrying about her marriage, the father sets up a fake arranged marriage for himself to remarry in order to convince her daughter to be wedded. **Ojōsan Kanpai** (Here's to the Girls) (1949) Keizo Ishizu, a single hard-working owner of a car factory, is offered an arranged marriage with Yasuko. She is a daughter of a former aristocratic family, and he falls in love with her beauty.

Meshi (1951) Married for over five years, Hatsunosuke and Michiyo live modestly in Osaka. Their conversation is in a diminishing trend when one day his uninhibited niece drops by for a visit.

Hakuchi (The Idiot) (1951) Kameda returns from the recent war and heads for his home town in Hokkaido. During his journey home he meets Akama, and they are both attracted by Taeko whose portrait is shown at a photo studio in Sapporo. They try to win her love but Akama attempts to marry her by offering money.

Bakushu (*Early Summer*) (1951) Noriko, 28 year-old single working woman, is advised by her uncle and also her boss at work to consider an arranged marriage match. This causes quite a commotion within her family.

Tokyo Monogatari (**Tokyo Story**) (1953) An old couple from Onomichi, the countryside, visit Tokyo to see their children but their eldest son and daughter are too busy to care for them. Only the wife of their second son who died in the war, has time to be with them. An immortal classic around the world.

Yama no Oto (1954) Shuichi is married to Kikuko and they live with Shuichi's parents. His relationship with Kikuko is chilled as he has a mistress, and the elderly father feels sorry for his son's wife. One day Kikuko goes out, but this is to abort her child conceived with her husband. Shūu (Sudden Rain) (1956) Ryotaro and Fumiko, being married for four years, have no children and become weary of their married life. One day a new couple named Imazato moves in next door, and Fumiko's beauty attracts Imazato's attention while Ryotaro gets interested in Imazato's wife and her youthfulness.

Chieko Shō (1957) A poet Kotaro Takamura marries Chieko who has passion for poem and oil painting. Their married life is modest yet happy one, however, her paintings are not appreciated. Chieko, struggling with the paining as well as housework, gradually begins to suffer from mental illness.

Akibiyori (Late Autumn) (1960) Seven years after her husband's death, Akiko who lives with her daughter Ayako meets the old friends. One of them recommends an arrange marriage for Ayako, but she is hesitant because if she married, her mother would have to live alone. As a solution to this problem, an arranged marriage match proposal is presented to Akiko by Hirayama, one of the old friends.
